- To be admitted to the art education emphasis, students must meet the following criteria: a. Complete with a grade of C or higher: Art 100, 101, 103, 104, 258, and 259.
 - b. Have a cumulative GPA of 2.50 or higher;
 - c. Students not meeting the minimum GPA may petition for special consideration.

This major satisfies the B.A. degree in applied arts and sciences. The degree may be used to satisfy some of the application requirements for the single subject teaching credential program at SDSU. Candidates for the single subject credential program at SDSU must complete all requirements as outlined in the University Catalog under Dual Language and English Learner Education or Teacher Education. SINGLE SUBJECT ART EDUCATION CREDENTIAL PROGRAM IN THE SCHOOL OF TEACHER EDUCATION

The **Art Major in Partial Preparation for the Single Subject Teaching Credential** provides students with a broad, comprehensive background in the arts. Courses from a wide variety of areas are required, and include experiences in drawing and painting, ceramics, jewelry/metals, textiles, and art history. Students in Art Education/Single Subject Teaching must complete the requirements specified by the College of Education for entrance into the <u>2-3 semester</u> Single Subject Credential Program.

Prerequisites for SDSU's Teacher Credential program

Students in **Art Major in Partial Preparation for the Single Subject Teaching Credential** that intend to apply to **SDSU's Teacher Credential program** must complete the following courses. Prerequisite courses must be complete prior to beginning the program. Often students take these as part of their undergraduate program and/or during the summer prior to the start of the Credential Program.

- 1. CBEST Examination passed prior to admission to the Single Subject Program.
- 2. Subject Matter Competency. (Successful completion of CSET exam.)
- 3. Completion of ED 451 "Introduction to Multicultural Education," TE 280 "Heath Education for Teachers" and SPED 450 "Classroom Adaptations for Special Populations" with grades of "C", "CR" or better, no more than seven years prior to admission to the Single Subject Credential Program.
- 4. Cumulative GPA of at least 2.67 in all baccalaureate and post-baccalaureate course work or a grade point average of at least 2.75 in the last 60 semester units attempted.
- 5. Two (or more) letters of recommendation.
- 6. TB Clearance.
- 7. California Certificate of Clearance.
- 8. Early Field Experience.
- 9. Personal Narrative (further information is available in EBA-255, School of Teacher Ed.).
